MRS CLARE MALONE RIP

We were saddened by the news of the death of Mrs Clare Malone who rendered valuable services as a staff member during 1965 – 1975.

Clare was a Laboratory Assistant who worked closely with the late John Hayball, Senior Chemistry Master.

Dear Parents, Caregivers, Students, Staff and Friends of the College,

A memorable School Mass was held on Friday 14th August to celebrate the Feast of the Assumption. Mary, the mother of Jesus, holds a special place in the Marist tradition as a model of service, humility and fidelity. I was particularly impressed with the respectful manner in which the students participated in the liturgy and the whole school was deeply moved by the Brothers' rendition of 'Sub Tuum Praesidium', a devotional poem to Mary that was sung at the conclusion of Mass.

The school has been immersed in the intensity of the academic program over the last few weeks, with the rigours of Trial Examinations for Year 12 and the Subject Selection Process for students in Year 10 and 11. In the case of the former, trial examinations expose students to the intense experiences they will confront with public examinations in November and they aim to test the level of course content and skills that have been learned from the early weeks of the year. They are also used to fine tune the learning program and revision patterns over the remaining weeks of the year. The SACE Parent Evenings held in weeks 4 and 5 respectively, are very significant gatherings as they outline courses of study, pre-requisite bench marks and potential careers that relate to subject choices into the future. I urge all to embrace this time of year and respond to the challenges that are an integral part of senior secondary schooling.

The final week of programmed sport was held on Saturday 15th August, and it rounded off another outstanding season of achievement for hundreds of students who give of their time and talent in the co-curricular program. The Open A Netball Team came top of the schools' competition yet again, and for the first time in memory the Open Soccer Team has won through to the State Knock-Out Finals. The 1st XVIII Football was magnificent throughout the season and narrowly missed out on another State Championship, while Open A Basketball reached the top 4 schools in the competition before being eliminated in a tough contest against Trinity College. Hockey, Debating, Girls Soccer and Football were also part of the rich programme that involved so many and produced appreciable gains in the area of commitment, team work and skill development. Sincere thanks are extended to the students, parents, staff and old scholars who give so generously to these many and varied aspects of school life.

And the Annual Exchange with Kilmore was a magnificent re-enactment of a tradition that spans 54 years. Our students represented their school and their families with much distinction – one that we can be truly proud of. Congratulations to all involved.

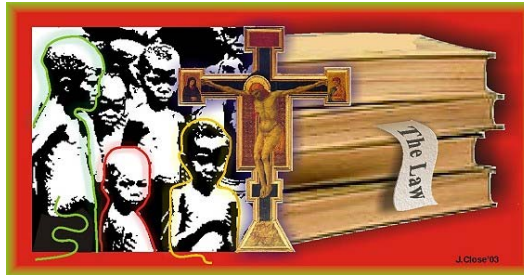

Our Students immerse themselves into the Kangaroo Island Lifestyle....



Kangaroo Island and in particular, the Vivonne Bay Outdoor Education Centre was a place of energy and new experiences over a 3 day period, for one of our Year 12 Tourism classes. Our aim was to experience, participate in and research what it was that made the Kangaroo Island tourism market one of our state’s most popular regions for interstate and international travellers.



Students visited a large proportion of sites on KI in our dirt road conquering Toyota Coaster. Some of the more popular attractions were the

Stokes Bay cave trek, Kingscote Little Penguin colony, Seal Bay Australian Sealion experience, fishing for squid on the Vivonne Bay Jetty and the island’s most popular attraction, the Remarkable Rocks.



Students were exemplary representatives of their school while collecting tourism data through surveying both the local community and tourists to the island. Other research involved Fran’s photography extravaganza, Hazem’s interviews with the local stakeholders and Rupert’s excellent field work skills with the island’s park rangers.



Many thanks go to Simon Ward of Kangaroo Island Eco Adventures for his organisation of the catering, accommodation and leisure activities. Simon also spent the entire final day with us, giving his expert guidance to our students which was an invaluable experience for all involved. This experience was made extra special by the koalas and wallabies surrounding us; an evening that will be remembered for a long time to come.

This is a link that can only be understood upon travelling to South Australia’s natural wonderland.
